

REGULATING ELECTRICITY TARIFFS AND RELATED ISSUES

Programme Overview

The programme is designed to apprise participants of the principles and methodology of tariff regulation enunciated in the Electricity Act – 2003 and subsequent policy and regulations. The programme covers the various components of a typical filing for Annual Revenue Requirements (ARR) and tariff revision with respect to the generation, transmission and distribution of electricity as well as issues of retail tariff design. The programme includes issues pertaining to Open Access, Electricity Trading and Development of Markets and the challenges being faced currently.

- ◆ Develop an understanding of the current issues pertaining to regulating electricity tariffs in India in generation, transmission and distribution and the design of retail tariffs
- ◆ Gain an insight into important tariff related issues dealt with by the ERCs and the Appellate Tribunal for Electricity.
