## How confident are you that your facility shall not face this situation? Application No. 302 of 2017 – NGT

*For the violation already committed and the remarks of the joint inspection team, the hospital shall pay a sum of Rs.2,00,000/- as environmental compensation within two weeks to SPCB or PCC. In the event the compensation is not paid, the same shall be recovered as arrears of land revenue.*

### Introduction:

Health Care Facilities (HCFs) plays an important role in supporting the public in overcoming their health challenges and in enhancing the health and well-being of the society. The persons involved in the HCFs are performing a noble cause. At the same time, the HCFs generate “Bio-Medical Waste (BMW)”, which needs to be handled carefully during collection to treatment and disposal. Poor management of BMW exposes healthcare workers, waste handlers and the community to infections, toxic effects and injuries. Also, the unscientific way of disposing BMW leads to “Environmental Issues” such as causing air, land and water pollution.

### Regulation:

Recognizing the need to regulate the BMW, Government of India brought specific regulations known as “Bio-Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016” and its amendment in 2018 and 2019 under the provisions of the Environment (Protection) Act, 1996. These rules shall apply to all persons who generate, collect, receive, store, transport, treat, dispose, or handle bio medical waste in any form including hospitals, nursing homes, clinics, dispensaries, veterinary institutions, animal houses, pathological laboratories, blood banks, ayush hospitals, clinical establishments, research or educational institutions, health camps, medical or surgical camps, vaccination camps, blood donation camps, first aid rooms of schools, forensic laboratories and research labs (Rule 2). All the HCFs are mandated to obtain authorization for handling the BMW in line with the rules notified. Common Bio-medical Waste Treatment Facility (CBMWTF) were established to support the HCFs safe disposal of their bio-medical waste for treatment at a centralized facility. Telangana State Pollution Control Board is the prescribed authority for implementation of these rules in the state of Telangana.

### Workshop Objectives:

- ◆ Bringing together the authority, HCFs and experts to discuss on BMW and compliance requirements
- ◆ Sharing of experience by the Common Bio-Medical Waste Treatment Facilities (CBMWTF) and HCFs on scientific handling of BMW
- ◆ Sensitizing the important stakeholders (HCFs and CBMWTF) in achieving enhanced compliance requirements
