Background

The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act (RTFCLARR), 2013 became effective from 1st January, 2014. The two community-centric provisions in the 2013 Act that has raised implementation concerns is the provision of Social Impact Assessment (SIA) study and the special safeguards for the protection of land/community rights of the tribal population.

SIA has now become an integral part of the project preparation process. The RFCTLARR Act, 2013 requires the conduct of a mandatory SIA Study prior to initiation of land acquisition. The legislation also specifies an elaborate process for the conduct of the Study and its subsequent evaluation by an Expert Group. Similarly, land cannot be acquired in scheduled areas without the consent of the Gram Sabhas under the 2013 Act. The law also ensures that all rights guaranteed under such legislation as the Panchayat (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act 1996 and the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 are taken care of, besides guaranteeing special enhanced benefits for those belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. The Scheduled Tribe and other traditional forest dwellers who have lost any of their forest rights recognized under the FRA, 2006 due to acquisition of land is defined as a 'landowner' and 'affected family' under the Act.

While these provisions have been incorporated to ensure a more inclusive and equitable outcome of the land acquisition process, lack of comprehensive understanding of the operational modalities and institutional unpreparedness have marred their effective implementation.

Programme Objectives

How can we ensure that SIA becomes a powerful decision making tool as conceptualised by the new land acquisition Act. Within the mandated timeline, what should we do to ensure that the SIA Study does complete justice to its laudable objectives? How can SIA surveys be made more accurate and effective? How should SIA Study be monitored? How can conflicts be effectively managed in land acquisition projects? What are the statutory requirements for convening of gram sabha under various legislations and how can we expedite the procedures while adhering to the prescribed law/policies? What are the operational modalities for recognizing/vesting forest rights on lands that have to be acquired for development projects?. There is a need for comprehensive understanding of the processes and due diligence measures for meeting the statutory requirements while expediting the land acquisition process. It is with this prerogative that the Centre for Excellence in Management of Land Acquisition, Resettlement and Rehabilitation, ASCI is organising our Annual Course on SIA and FRA.

The key objectives of the programme are:

- To develop an understanding of the special laws relating to acquisition/diversion of private/forest land and the statutory rights of forest dwelling/tribal population in the country.
- To develop an understanding of the social impacts in diverse development projects, tools and techniques for predicting these social impacts and developing appropriate mitigation plans.

- To provide an in-depth understanding of measures to effectively conduct and monitor the SIA study as envisaged under the RFCTLARR Act, 2013.
- To provide clarity for effective implementation of the FRA, 2006 prior to diversion of forest land for development projects.

About CMLARR, ASCI

Established with the support of the World Bank and AusAID, CMLARR has been leading the capacity building interventions for LARR specialist officers in India and in the South Asian region. The Centre has been engaged in supporting the Department of Land Resources, Government of India as well as various state governments in the implementation of the RFCTLARR Act, 2013. The Centre has conducted customised capacity building programs on the RFCTLARR Act, 2013 for the Governments of Karnataka, Bihar, Tamil Nadu, Punjab and Sikkim. Dealing officers from 20 state governments have also participated in the LARR Courses at ASCI. The Centre has also prepared a comprehensive Courseware on LARR, covering detailed step-wise procedures for LA and R & R in line with the RFCTLARR Act, 2013. The Centre has been involved extensively in capacity building interventions on "Improved Management of Land Acquisition, Resettlement & Rehabilitation " for Senior IAS Officers, World Bank supported Projects, ADB supported Projects, Government organisations and several public/private sector organizations in the country.

CMLARR is conducting Joint Certification Programmes in LARR partnering the National Research Centre for Resettlement (NRCR), Hohai University, China. Other prominent international assignments of the Centre include customized module for "Formulating a National Resettlement Policy and Improved Management of LARR" for the Ministerial delegation from Government of Uganda and Egypt; international programs/workshops on R & R and Benefit Sharing, advisory guidance to University of Peradeniya, Sri-Lanka in improving their LARR Course, support for various Training of Trainers Workshops organized by World Bank for South Asian countries etc.

Training Methods

This 5-day intensive programme places emphasis on interactive learning. The highly interactive learning environment combines experience sharing, case studies, role play exercises and lectures cum-discussion. The mix of the methods aims to provide ample opportunity to the participants to learn from the peer group and faculty/subject experts.

Venue

The Programme is fully residential and the participants will be accommodated in air-conditioned single occupancy rooms in the Bella Vista/College Park Campus of the College. The College does not provide accommodation for the family. Transport between Airport / Railway Station and Campus will be arranged by the College. The College campus is WiFi enabled.

Duration

The Programme duration is from **Monday, 3rd June, 2019 to Friday, 7th June, 2019** . The participants are expected to arrive a day before the commencement and may leave after the conclusion of the programme.

Programme Fee

Residential Fee : Rs. 59,500/- plus GST as applicable, presently 18% per participant. The fee covers tuition, board and lodging, courseware (in electronic form) and other facilities of the College including Internet usage.

Non-Residential Fee: Rs.49,500/- plus GST as applicable, presently 18% per participant. The fee covers tuition, course ware (in electronic form) working lunch and other facilities of the College including internet usage.
