



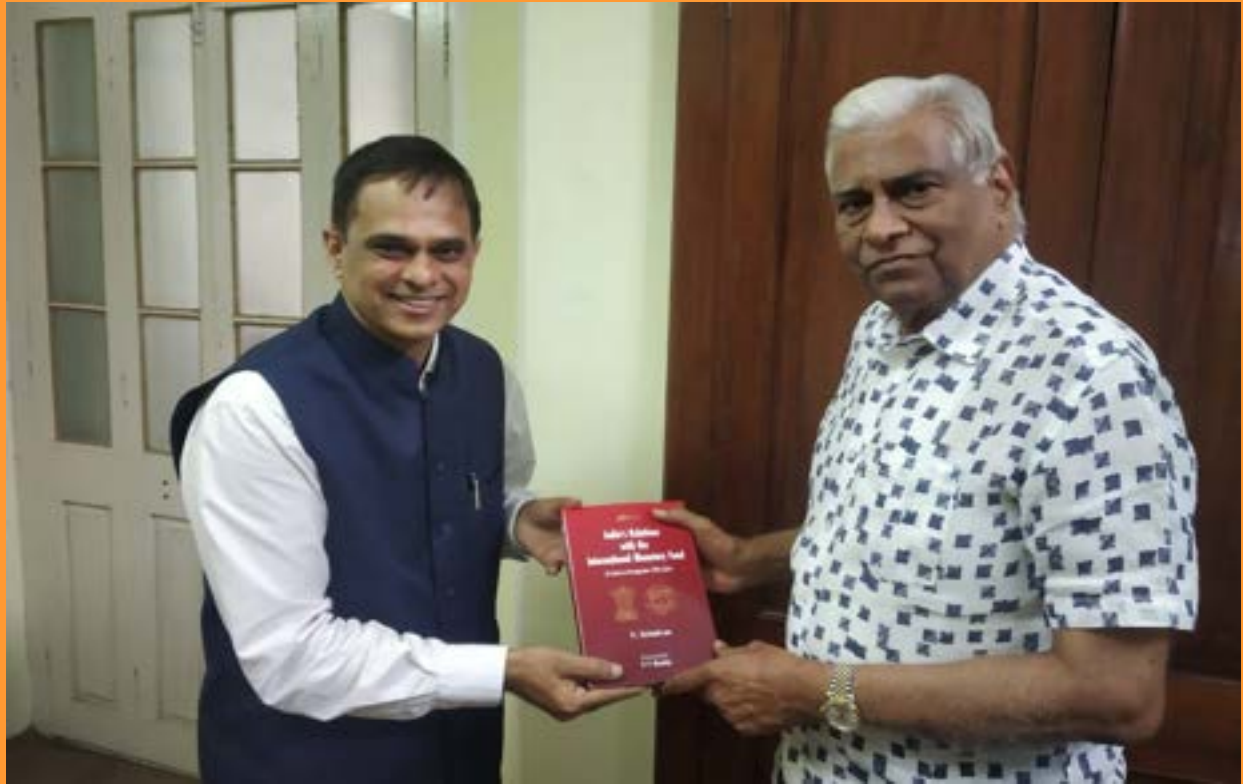

The Government of India has accepted the ASCI project teams' suggested measures to revamp the CGTSME scheme. Accordingly, these measures have been included as a part of the Union Budget 2022.



## Our Work

### Research & Management Studies

This has been a challenging year, with two Covid-19 waves hitting us in a single year. Last year we faced only one wave. Due to the second wave of the Pandemic, there was a lockdown, and the College was closed for 41 days in Q1. Also, due to the third wave of the Pandemic and per the directives of the Govt. of Telangana, the College was closed for 24 days in Q4. Naturally, this hurt R&C work. Even then, the team worked hard to service clients, and we have met and exceeded the budget targets.

In FY 2021-22, we could secure 48 projects from different clients worth a total of Rs. 23.1 Crores, and we were able to close 38 projects.

Some of the projects conducted by the faculty have received much acclaim in FY 2021-22.

They are:

1. The government of India accepted the measures suggested by our project team to revamp the CGTSME scheme. Accordingly, these measures have been included as a part of the Union Budget 2022.
2. Horticulture Plan prepared by ASCI for Govt. of Telangana was accepted in full and is being implemented. **The Honourable Chief Minister of Telangana personally appreciated the work.**
3. FSTP plants created as an outcome of some of our projects are now operational. Two have been inaugurated recently.
4. ASCI's work in collaboration with FICCI on COVID-19 management has been highlighted regularly in the media.
5. ASCI's research support to DARPG for developing the Vision India @ 2047.

### Revenue

The revenue from Research and Consultancy in FY 2021-22 stands at Rs. 23.87 Crores. Despite two waves of Covid -19 hitting us in this financial year, we have been able to post a better result than last year. The R&C revenue this year has increased by 7% over last year. In addition, this year, we have added a new category to our portfolio: conducting pilot-scale studies. With the government's approval, we are glad to report that we are implementing a technology-enabled health initiative on a pilot scale in one whole district of the state of Andhra Pradesh.



## New projects

The College was able to secure 48 new projects worth 23.1 Crores in FY 2021-22. In addition, 38 projects were closed/completed during the year, and 91 projects are ongoing.

## Management Development Programmes

Training activities from April 2021 to March 2022 were conducted in on-campus, off-campus and online formats. In the last financial year, the College has been able to establish new collaborations and new clients.

A series of 10 Webinars and workshops have also attracted about 3800 participants from across the country and abroad.

In the FY 2021-22, we have conducted 21 on-campus in-company training programmes for Banks and PSUs, with about 526 participants visiting our campus in addition to the 20 announced programmes with 235 participants.

A total of 29 online programmes have been conducted, of which 15 are announced and 14 are ICTP programmes and a total of 674 participants with intense class work and interactive sessions. In addition, we have also conducted 4 Webinars with 1200 participants.

We have been able to secure nominations for programmes conducted under new initiatives in collaboration with UCLA (Artificial Intelligence), INSOFE (Design Thinking in Digital Transformation), Access Health International (Health Informatics and Health Insurance), "Smart transformations" (Cyber Resiliency), ADBI (City-Wide Inclusive Sanitation) during the year. The programmes were well received, and it is proposed to conduct them in the current financial year.

The total revenue from training activity (on-campus and online) is Rs. 882 lakhs as of March 31 2022



## Long Duration Programmes (PGDM & PGDM (HM))

### **PGDM (Hospital Management)**

The ASCI PGDHM Program at Dr Kakarla Subbarao Centre for Health Care Management had an intake of 63 admissions in batch 16 (2021-23). Last year Batch 15 also had 60 admissions. The good work done by PGDHM last year, like health care conferences, live projects, student internships, and 100 per cent placements, also helped improve the program's visibility. All sessions were held in hybrid mode in the first semester (August 2021 to February 2022). In the second semester from March 1 2022, all students were on campus after adopting all COVID guidelines. During the year, applications of excel, Data analytics, Hospital Operations management, Health System Strengthening and Communication Skills were added.

### **PGDM**

The ASCI PGDM Program at the Centre for Management Studies had an intake of 30 students in batch 2021-23. The entire 2-year course has 28 Credits and two non-credit courses. The students are from various backgrounds of B. Com, B. Tech, BBA, BCA, B. Sc, M. Tech and MBA from six states. For this batch, we had increased the fees by 25% over 2020-22, i.e. they are paying Rs. 7.5 Lakhs fees whereas batch 2020-22 fees was Rs. 6.0 Lakhs.

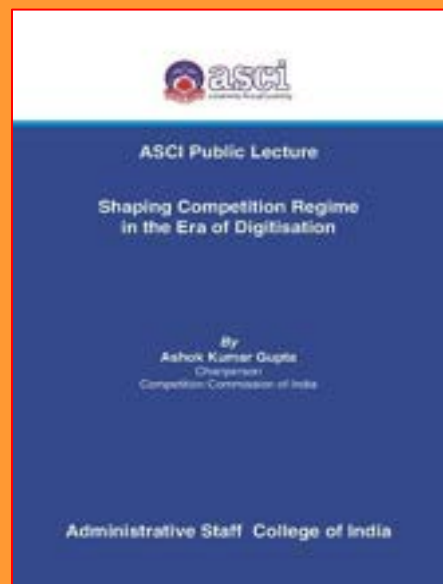
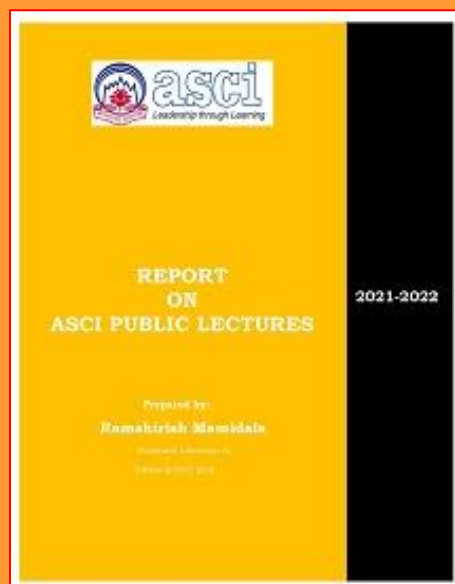

Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) chairman G Sateesh Reddy said India has the world's longest Advanced Towed Artillery Gun System with a range of more than 48 kms. Final trials were being conducted and very soon it would be inducted into the armed forces, he said.

"This was one technology, which was eluding us earlier but we could develop our own kind now. I can proudly say this is world longest range gun," said Sateesh Reddy on Thursday.

He was delivering an online lecture on "Accelerating Defence R&D for Atmanirbhar Bharat" as part of Administrative Staff College of India's public lecture series. Speaking on the occasion, he said India was set to join the ranks of key countries in the world in the coming years in defence products manufacturing and exports. Already, steps have been taken in this direction. Over the past few decades, research has

shown that India has achieved self-sufficiency in the manufacture of missiles, radars, aircraft, army vehicles, and communication systems, he said. Similarly, India was among the top countries in the world to have ballistic missile defence systems. After US, Russia and China, India has emerged as the country equipped with the system of direct demolition of satellites.

"Gradually, we are moving from importing to exporting defence products. It is our endeavour to develop all the systems to be equipped with AI technology," said Sateesh Reddy, revealing that the BrahMos

updated system was successfully launched again on Thursday.

Lot of activity was being taken up in the cyberspace solutions. One cannot be ignorant of this space and to ensure secured solutions, lot of things, including hardware, software and operating systems are being developed, he said. "Similarly, we are encouraging private companies to manufacture defence products. DCPD (Development from Production - Partner) policy was brought," Sateesh Reddy said, adding, already a few missile and bomb manufacturing projects have been sanctioned to some private companies in Hyderabad. This apart, nearly two thousand companies were currently in the manufacturing of defence products across the country.

He said as per Prime Minister Narendra Modi's instructions, five specialised laboratories were set up at five locations, including Hyderabad, to encourage young scientists under the age of 35 to further promote research in the defence sector.

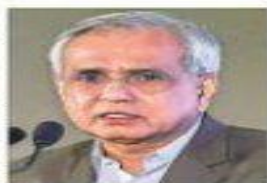



नीति आयोग उपाध्यक्ष ने कहा, "ऐसी स्थिति में मुझे लगता है कि तेल और अन्य जिस कीमतों पर दबाव नरम होकर कम होगा। लिहाजा मुझे उम्मीद है कि ईंधन एवं जिसों की कीमतों में वृद्धि उस तरह होगी जिस तरह वर्ष 2021 में हुई थी।" हालांकि, उन्होंने खाद्य मुद्रास्फीति को बड़ी चिंता का विषय बताते हुए कहा कि प्रशासकीय एवं अन्य तरीकों से इसका बेहतर प्रबंधन किया जा सकता है।

वित्त वर्ष 2022-23 के लिए पेश बजट का जिक्र करते हुए उन्होंने कहा कि इसमें भारत को अगले 25 वर्षों में डिजिटल रूप से सशक्त, विश्वस्तरीय ढांचे से लैस और स्तरीय शिक्षा एवं स्वास्थ्य सुविधाएं देने के लिए एक ठोस बुनियाद रखने की बात की गई है। कुमार ने कहा, "मेरी राय में इस बजट की मुख्य विषयवस्तु अगले 25 वर्षों के लिए एक ठोस बुनियाद रखने से जुड़ी है।" इसके साथ ही उन्होंने कहा कि यह बजट समावेशी विकास को बेहतर ढंग से अंजाम देने और व्यवस्था के निचले स्तर पर मौजूद लोगों को भी इस प्रक्रिया में शामिल करने की बात करता है।

## Global Fuel, Commodity Prices May Soften Going Forward: NITI Aayog Vice Chairman

Stating that the Union Budget does not stoke any inflationary pressure, NITI Aayog Vice Chairman Rajiv Kumar on Tuesday said the rise in international fuel and commodity prices may not continue going forward.

Delivering a lecture through a virtual platform on the Union Budget organised by the Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI) here, he said the global slowdown is largely due to the slowdown of the two largest economies, the US and China.

"The budget is not going to be inflationary. I don't think there is any inflationary bias to the budget. Yes, of course, there will be globally imported inflation. The IMF has said that global economy will slow down from 5.9 to 4.8 per cent. That slow down is largely, almost totally, the result of the slowdown of the two largest economies, the US and China," Kumar said.

"So, I think that particular pressure on commodity prices, including oil prices, would soften, would subside. Therefore, I expect that the fuel and commodity prices need not continue to rise as they have done in 2021," he further said.

The major concern, however, is food inflation which can be managed better through administrative and other measures, he said.

On the Budget, he said it seeks to lay a solid foundation for achieving a digitally-empowered India, with world-class infrastructure and global-level education and health sectors, in the next 25 years and it also aims to improve inclusion, and targets those at the bottom of the pyramid.

"I think the unifying theme for the budget is to lay the solid foundation for achieving our vision of a digitally-empowered India, with world class infrastructure and globally comparable education and health sectors in the next 25 years. I think this is the budget trying to lay the foundation for that," he said.

The focus of the budget has been to address the constraints which are in the way of the country grasping the opportunities of the fourth industrial revolution, he said.

The budget specifically mentions that other than innovation and sunrise sectors and frontier technologies, the government sees private investment as the principal driver of growth, he said.

He said innovation, investments, inclusion and integrity are the four pillars to the budget, talking about various aspects of the budget.

He also said employment can be generated through the acceleration of economic activity, especially in employment-intensive sectors like construction and infrastructure.

He added that the budget seeks to yank the country's economy out of the shadows of the pandemic and lay down the foundation for a vibrant future.

# 'ISRO, NASA building a US\$ 1-billion satellite'

Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) are jointly building a US\$ 1 billion satellite with latest large reflectors, high antenna and others, for clear data transmission.

"It is a unique mission where both agencies will be involved in mission design, instruments, payloads and the launch vehicle with the US agency pitching in most funds," said former ISRO chairman A.S. Kiran Kumar on Wednesday.

The eagerly awaited 'Human Space Mission Programme' got delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic and this project will give a big fillip to the country's development as a large number of science and technology plat-

forms are working on it, he said, during a virtual presentation on 'Space Technology Development and Use: An Indian Approach' organised by the Administrative Staff College of India.

Indian space programme has always sought collaborative efforts and is running about 50 satellites tracking weather, communication, strategic issues, etc. and this number has to be doubled with the help of the private sector for enhancing capaci-

ties. "Space laws and policies have to be modified as globally it is the private entities leading the innovation," he said.

The government has initiated 'New Space India Ltd' to own the launch vehicles and space assets of ISRO and Tata Sky has signed up to make use of capacities in the upcoming satellite 'GSAT-24' to be launched by ArianeSpace. IN-Space is another entity to regulate space activities and facilitate offering public facilities and expertise to startups and 40 proposals were received, said Mr. Kumar, also the Vikram Sarabhai professor at ISRO.

Tracing the growth of space programme under the 'visionary leadership' of Sarabhai, he said the objective has always been make "innovative use of accessible technology for addressing socie-

tal problems and build what is not available". ISRO has been able to have a trailblazing run because of the "freedom to take decisions, and a robust review system".

It began with 'sounding rockets' borrowed from developed nations to be launched from Thumba (Kerala) from a dilapidated charrack building to 'SITE' experiment where the common man could be reached in remote places through satellite television and so on, which helped trigger the "telecom, broadcasting and meteorology services revolution".

"ITHI - Direct to Home TV is a follow-up of SITE and with the help of indigenous INSAT series, we are able to forecast a cyclone four days in advance, saving lives and helping fishermen reach their fishing spots directly

even while guiding them about weather in their mother tongue. GAGAN, or ge-augmented navigation, is for planning and precision landing of planes, and used by railways for real-time monitoring," he explained.

Satellite data is helping in mapping of landmass, agriculture planning, water resources identification, disaster management and recently in tracking the COVID virus spread. 'Chandrayaan' series was another landmark project as presence of water on moon was first identified. Future projects are in dealing with space debris threat and mining of the asteroids for precious metals as 12,000 each year pass close to earth, apart from space travel.

ASCI faculty member Valli Manickam and DG Nirmalya Bagchi also spoke.

## 5G will help in precision farming: TRAI chief

Vaghela says States with robust telecom infrastructure will generate more employment and attract investments

**Traffic management**  
In the energy and power grid sector, 5G would help in distribution of energy within a smart grid and smart meters. In the automotive industry, it would optimise traffic management, vehicle and school bus tracking, monitoring over-speeding

networks, precision farming, smart irrigation, climate change mitigation, livestock monitoring, and agricultural drones.

Apart from being beneficial in smart mining through real-time condition monitoring, he said that in the field of online education and learning which requires high-speed data connectivity, 5G technology is capable of providing the requisite bandwidth for students and institutions.

It also augments video surveillance and analytics, solid waste management, and intelligent parking in smart cities, and that the technology would

create an immersive experience in video streaming, gaming and sports domain, where user/machine-generated content from smart devices could help users to share data in real time, which is likely to improve the user experience.

Vaghela spoke about satellite-based communication being implemented in North-Eastern States and how it was helpful in far-flung hilly and rural areas. Observing that BharatNet project could change the scenario, he said that the last six years had seen a revolutionary change in rural areas in terms of growth of telecom and digital services.

STATES with a robust telecom infrastructure will attract more investments and generate employment, leading to an enhanced economy, said Dr P D Vaghela, Chairman of Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI).

"For the implementation of industrial automation (Industry 4.0), precision agriculture, smart education, automation in healthcare, and many areas, the State governments must strive to have the best and latest telecom technology in their State such as 5G, IoT, AI, Augmented Reality, Virtual Reality, etc.," he said.

Addressing the Administrative Staff College of India's (ASCI) online public lecture titled "5G: A Next-Generation Technology", on Wednesday, he spoke on introduction to 5G and key performance indicators, use cases of 5G, role of State governments, the growth of telecom in India, and government initiatives in the broadband and telecom reforms.

In agriculture, he said that 5G was going to be helpful for monitoring along with sensors,

## Report on 5G to be submitted by April: Trai chairman

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) is likely to submit its recommendation on the 5G spectrum by the end of this month or by the second week of April. After this, the Centre will look to take up auctions at the earliest and the post-auction work will take another three to five months, TRAI chairman Dr PD Vaghela said.

Delivering a virtual lecture on '5G: Next Generation Technology,' organised by the Administrative Staff College of India, he said the current 4G network can be used with some tweaks and the focus will be on launching the 5G service in urban areas first. "From the experience of countries where 5G has been launched, telecom operators are finding it difficult to increase the tariffs. However, industries and commercial establishments can opt for this initially in view of the speed," he said.

On a query on health concerns and also 5G interfering with aircraft safety systems, Vaghela said there are no studies yet that say 5G was responsible for these. The new technology is already being implemented by 90 plus countries and no incident has been reported on these lines, he pointed out. In India, there are 116.6 crore people who use mobile phones and about 83.3 crore internet users. The tariffs in India are among the lowest, he said.

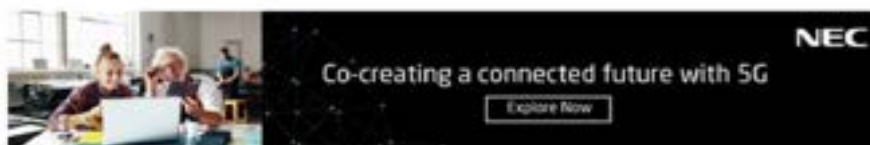

## 'India only second country to fly a bio-jet fuel flight'

**Hyderabad:** Dr Shekhar C Mande, director general of the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), said India was the only second country in the world to fly a flight with indigenous developed biofuels. CSIR-IIP, Dehradun, carried out a program on Bio-Jet fuel and demonstrated it by flying the IAF aircraft with mixed bio-jet fuel, he said on Thursday.

He virtually addressed the Administrative Staff College Public Lecture on "Science and Technology Innovations: Primary Vehicle to Obtain Our Rightful Place in World Order".

Emphasizing the measures for a sustainable future, he said it was time not to be dependent on fossil fuels and to focus on generating alternative fuels such as Biomass as fuel. "CSIR has developed India's first indigenous fuel cell car together with operating partner KPIT," said Dr Shekhar C Mande.

About the SARS-COV-2 diagnostic innovation – FELUDA – world's first CRISPR Cas-9 based COVID-19 test set; he said the paper strip-based simple test yields results within 45 to 50 minutes in a laboratory. "The test is traceable, transparent and trusted, with digital quality control and an AI-based results reporting tool," he explained.

With a list of Indian contributions to scientific developments from ancient times, he said the indelible ink developed in 1961 by CSIR-National Physical Laboratory (NPL) is now used in many countries around the world.
